Yvonne Zimmerman is the author of the 2012 book *Other Dreams of Freedom: Religion, Sex and Human Trafficking*. She holds a Ph.D. from Iliff School of Theology and the University of Denver, a Master of Theological Studies degree from Candler School of Theology, and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Goshen College.

Letitia Campbell's work at Candler includes directing Contextual Education I and Clinical Pastoral Education. She holds a Ph.D. from Emory University, a Master of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary, and Bachelor of Arts degrees from Davidson College and Oxford University, where she studied as a Rhodes Scholar.

Drs. Campbell and Zimmerman are collaborating on a book project focusing on the unique theological perspectives and moral resources that progressive Christianity can bring to the broadly shared goal of ending exploitation and human trafficking.
